

## 2018 Coachman Frelander 31BH Rental Manual

### A. Delivery/Pick up Check List:

#### 1. *Vehicle Physical Appearance walk through:*

- Exterior
- Interior

#### 2. *Vehicle Functionality Walk through:*

**Check off each step in training once it is completed:**

- Generator Training
- Kitchen Training
- Bathroom Training
- Furniture Training
- Tire Training
- Fluids Training
- Hitch Training (trailers)
- Water Hookup Training
- Power Hookup Training
- Cleaning Training
- Slide-out Training
- Unit Specific Training
- Awning Training
- Levelling Jacks Training
- TV Training

#### 3. *Driving Tutorial:*

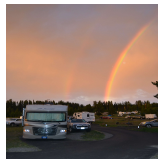
***Motorhome is like a large school bus. So you have to compensate for its length and height. Pay attention also to road conditions like wind speed, posted heights of overhead bridges, road restrictions for large vehicles, etc.***

*Familiarize renter with the following:*

- Engine Starting
- Backing Up
- Right Turn signal
- Left Turn signal
- Highway Driving
- Gas Stations
- Parking
- Appropriate Speed
- Residential Roads

### **DOT Regulations on Hazardous Materials – Propane**

- Shut off the RV's propane tank when you drive into a GAS STATION
- Shut off the RV's propane tank before driving through a TUNNEL



#### 4. *Other Vehicle Checklist*

Familiarize renter with the following:

- Tire Pressure
- Motor Oil
- Generator Oil
- Windshield Fluid
- Radiator Fluid
- Transmission Fluid
- Head Lights
- Mirror Check
- Turn Signals

#### 5. *Setup At Campgrounds or Overnight Stop:*

**With the vehicle's parking brake depressed:**

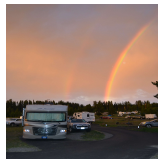
- Hookup the Electric power hose to shore power inlet (**Always use the "Surge Guard RV Power Protector"**) that we have provided
- Hookup fresh water hose to the water source
- Add at least 5 gallons of water and odor control chemical to the black tank (supplied)
- Remove the slide out lock (if included)
- Ensure that there are no obstructions on the path of the slide out
- Extend the slide out
- The receive Over the Air (OTA) TV signal, turn on TV booster inside the cabinet
- Extend the Awning (weather permitting). **Retract the awning in the night or when you leave the RV for an extended period to avoid wind damage to avoid the awning**
- Setout camping chairs (if feasible)

#### 6. *Pack up Procedures before leaving Campgrounds or Overnight Stop:*

- Empty black and grey tanks (if dump station is in the facility)
- Turn off TV booster inside the cabinet
- Retract awning
- Pack up plates and pots
- Pack up camping chairs
- Retract slide out
- Close all drawers and doors
- Replace the slide out lock (if included)
- Remove and store away Electric hookup cable
- Remove and store away fresh water hookup hose

#### B. *How Slide Out Works:*

- Do not operate the slide out unless the vehicle is level. Use the levelling blocks provided for this purpose.**
- The battery reading must be "Full". The slide out may not operate if the battery voltage is low.**
- To ensure better voltage, run the generator for a few minutes before operating the slide out if not connected to electricity.**
- The slide out will not work if the Vehicle's engine is running or ignition is on the on position**
- Hookup the Electric power hose to shore power inlet or turn on the generator



\_\_\_ Vehicle should be parked at fairly level ground

\_\_\_ **Vehicle parking brake must be depressed**

\_\_\_ To Extend: Press and hold the extend button until the slide has completely extended.

\_\_\_ To Retract: Press and hold the extend button until the slide has completely retracted.

### **C. How RV Generator Works:**

#### **Note:**

- i. The generator will not start if the house battery is drained or low. Plug to shoreline or run the vehicle to recharge the house battery.**
- ii. The inverter and A/C draw so much power at start up. So allow the generator time before turning the A/C on.**

\_\_\_ Ensure that all electric appliances are turned off (e.g. lights, A/C, Fridge, etc.)

\_\_\_ Press and hold the generator “Stop” button to prime it

\_\_\_ Press and hold the generator “Start” button and release when its engine cranks.

\_\_\_ Allow generator to warm up before adding load to it

#### **To stop the generator:**

\_\_\_ Press and hold the generator stop button for a few seconds for the engine to stop.

### **D. How Awning Works:**

**Do not leave the awning extended overnight or while you are gone far from the RV. Wind will destroy the awning.**

**The awning will not work if the Vehicle’s engine is running or ignition is on the on position**

\_\_\_ Press and hold the awning out button until the awning extends fully.

\_\_\_ Press and hold the awning in button until the awning retracts fully

### **E. How Fridge Works:**

\_\_\_ **The Fridge can be powered by either LPG/Generator/Shore power**

\_\_\_ Set power on “auto” (the fridge automatically chooses LPG or Electric power source).

**To troubleshoot the fridge, turn it off for 10 minutes so it can reboot or reset itself.**

### **F. How the Cooker Works:**

**The Cooker is powered by LPG (Propane)**

**The oven can be turned on with a lighter or the built-in ignitor**

\_\_\_ Turn the ignitor and burner knob simultaneously to light each of the three burners

\_\_\_ To light the oven, turn the oven’s knob to “Pilot” and use a lighter to light the pilot inside the oven compartment. Then set the oven to your desired heat level.

**Use a lighter to light the burners if the ignitor does not work**

### **G. How A/C Works:**

**If the A/C is being powered by the generator, wait at least 10 minutes before turning the A/C on.**

\_\_\_ The A/C is powered by Generator/Shore power only. **It cannot work on residential 15 amp power.**

\_\_\_ Use the keypad to select your desired temperature

\_\_\_ It is best to set the fan’s power to “auto” position

**If the A/C stops working, turn it off for 10 minutes to reboot.**



**H. How the Heater Works:**

*The heater is powered by LPG (Propane)*

\_\_\_ Use the keypad to select your desired temperature

\_\_\_ It is best to set the fan's power to "auto" position

**I. How Toilet Works:**

**Always leave water on the toilet bowl to prevent odor from entering the coach.**

\_\_\_ Depress the foot flush mechanism to either fill the bowl with water or to flush the toilet
